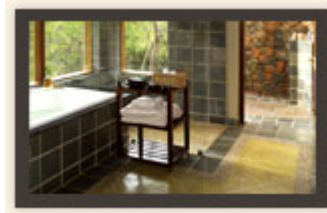

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Sabi Sabi



Sabi Sabi is located to the West of the legendary **Kruger National Park** in the Sabi Sands Game Reserve, a place that plays host to the greatest diversity of wildlife in the world. Renowned for its predator population the Sabi Sands guarantees a wildlife experience beyond compare. Game drives are taken in open-top Landrovers offering **panoramic** views of the bush and the animals. Your guides include a Shangaan tracker and experienced game ranger, who will get you very close to the wildlife in the park. Walking safaris are available for an intimate wilderness experience.

Accommodation is at the Selati Camp, an intimate colonial style lodge offering luxury, thatched suites with en-suite bathrooms and open-air showers. Selati Camp is lit mainly by romantic lamp light used to enhance the ambient beauty of this lodge. With decks built over the riverbed, your views of the bush are unsurpassed.

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Buffelsdrift Game Lodge



BUFFELSDRIFT Game Lodge is a sprawling game farm in the fertile Cango Valley at the foot of the Swartberg Mountains – South Africa's 6th World Heritage Site. Lush Succulent Karoo vegetation and a 5 ha natural waterhole create a haven for a variety of game species including: elephants, rhino and Cape buffalo (3 of the Big Five); giraffe; hippo; Cape Mountain zebra; Eland; Kudu and Springbok. Enthusiastic bird watcher's will enjoy trying to identify the more than 217 bird species to be found in the area, the ostrich of course being the easiest. Situated 7 km outside **Oudtshoorn**, in the **Western Cape** the Lodge is in the heart of ostrich country, half-an-hour's drive from the Swartberg Mountain Nature Reserve and the isolated valley of Gamkaskloof ("Die Hell"). It lies just off the famous Route 62 and is part of the scenic circle route – Oudtshoorn – the Swartberg Mountain Pass – via the historic village of Prince Albert – through the spectacular Meiringspoort gorge which you exit just before the quaint village of De Rust, after which you return to Oudtshoorn. Accommodation is in luxury en-suite tents with air conditioning, which, like the conference venue, restaurant and wedding chapel are on the edge of the waterhole and offer breathtaking views of the Klein Karoo. Trained guides will escort guests on an early morning or late afternoon game drive (bush safari) in an open game viewing vehicle, with a pitstop at one of the lookout points – presenting the perfect opportunity for spectacular photographs and a chance to relax and enjoy the views. Ice-cold sundowners served on the lookout deck next to the open-air bar mark the end of a perfect day with the sun setting over the mountains.

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Mabula River Lodge

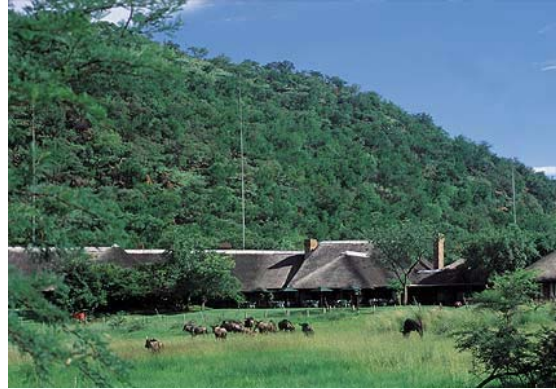

Peninsula Tour

Discover the rich historical and cultural heritage of this area where splendid examples of Cape Dutch, Victorian and Georgian architecture have been preserved. The Winelands will leave you with lasting memories of warm hospitality and unsurpassed natural beauty. Continue to Franschhoek, Valley of the Huguenots. Visit the museum and Huguenot Memorial. Enjoy a wine tasting at a premier estate, before stopping for lunch. After lunch proceed to Stellenbosch, surrounded by vineyards, fruit orchards and mountains. Much of this town's character, where oak-lined streets still shade original water furrows, will be seen while on a short walk in Dorp Street, a rich and rewarding experience.

After exploring the harbour, you will visit the museum with all the memorabilia of by-gone era's....trophies of the undaunting spirit and pride of the village. Lunch, consisting of the most popular of local cuisine, fish and chips, will then be enjoyed at Mariner's Wharf, while the Cape Minstrels provides you with entertainment in true Cape Town style. A glass bottomed boat trip to seal island will further charm your senses, where after you will be returned to your place of stay.

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CAPE TOWN JAZZ SAFARI



Any seasoned traveller will tell you that to truly get to know the rhythm of a culture; you need to get to know the rhythms of its music. And in Cape Town, that means jazz. Cape Jazz is a distinctive mix of western and African influences, with riffs borrowed from all the kindred ports of the world, and infused with the jazz scenes everywhere, the jazz scene of the Cape tends to guard its secrets from newcomers. Finding the hot spots can take time and effort... unless a little Bird tells you where to

look. Under the accredited guidance of a local jazz aficionado, you will then enjoy privileged access to Abdullah Ibrahim's music school, "M7". A beautiful collection of black and white photos and an introductory talk will give you a feel for the city's distinguished jazz history. Next we move to the home of a key master musician, such as Cape Town's composer laureate Mac McKenzie. Mac lives in Bridgetown, which was the first coloured township of Cape Town. After Mac and his family have entertained us, it's on to our last stop. On Mondays we will attend a local jam session, which typically involves a melange of cool jazz, bebop and Cape Town standards. On any other day, we visit a second musician such as local ivory-tickler Hilton Schilder for a final half-hour of ear-candy. This is an opportunity to experience a rarefied side of Cape Town. The Jazz Safari puts you in the talented hands of those who make a living from conjuring the city's soul. You won't want to miss a beat.

TOWN SHIP TOUR



To really appreciate a place, one needs to get into the heart of its culture. And that is what this half-day tour will do for you. In a couple of stimulating hours, you will home in on three distinctly different communities that, through force of circumstances, have developed in unique and separate ways. Apart. As in that hateful word: Apartheid. Any understanding of present day conditions in South Africa is enhanced by looking at past injustice and the legacy of the struggle against Apartheid. Freedom has not come easily. On this tour you will pick up a wealth of insight into South African history. It includes a

brief educational introduction to Cape Town, one of the world's most culturally varied cities.

The Bo-Kaap (Upper Cape)

Turn your back on the skyscrapers and high-tech facades of Cape Town, and head back in time to the Mother City's "Malay Quarter", a lively, living museum and home to the oldest mosque in the Southern Hemisphere (one of ten such holy places in the neighborhood). The traditional inhabitants of Bo-Kaap are proud of their rich cultural heritage. They are mostly descendants of slaves who had been imported by the Dutch back in the 1700s. It's like entering a time warp. Brightly painted terrace houses line the streets, where men in robes intermingle with executives in suits and animated conversations are often interspersed with words in Arabic, Urdu and Afrikaans. Walking through the cobbled streets, you'll discover the unique culture, lifestyle and personality of the Cape Muslim community and their contribution to South Africa's development.

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District Six

An ominous silence hangs over this wide expanse of nothingness in the midst of an otherwise high-density city. This desolate landscape – flattened by bulldozers – was once the vibrant home of a unique community whose lives had been inextricably intertwined with Cape Town. As a result of the Group Areas Act, 60 000 Capetonian families were forcibly removed from the area between 1966 and 1982. The District Six issue remains crucial. You'll gain deeper understanding as we examine the deserted area, now named Zonnebloem, and visit the museum that attempts to represent and recapture District Six in various ways – as a fine-spun tapestry of communal life torn apart but not forgotten. The area is scarred with many vacant lots where houses once stood. If you look carefully you will be able to see the foundations of the front porches and the remains of some of the pavement stones. And if you set your mind to it, you might imagine what life may have been like before the bulldozers roared in...

The Townships and Cape Flats

And now for something completely different... You may find it shocking and tragic or view it as an example of survival against adversity and injustice. Whichever way you regard township life, this tour won't leave you unmoved. Seeking racial segregation, Apartheid policies disrupted all non-white population groups, distorted both rural and urban development and ensured hopeless overcrowding. Few houses were built. Sprawling satellite camps of seemingly endless shanties – makeshift structures of various materials – provide little more than a roof and some shelter. As we shall see, squatter settlements are seeking their own solutions as an economic necessity. Against all odds, township life prevails, in all its nuances.

As guests of local community workers, we'll take a walk through a vibrant black community with all its different social strata. This is Langa... Cape Town's oldest formal black township. You will have the opportunity to talk to residents and try the traditional African sorghum beer and ginger beer at a small township shop ("spaza") or a tavern ("shebeen"). We'll witness the work in progress as hundreds of squatters, with the help of state grants, are setting about building their own brick homes. This tour will take you right to the heart of the communities. And in many ways it will touch your own.

GOSPEL TOUR



Pull up a pew! It's time to experience praise and worship township-style, as your local guides in Langa, Cape Town, or Kayamandi, Stellenbosch, take you into the very heart of the community: the church. This tour throws you right into the deep end of township life – and surprise, surprise – the water's warm!

Across the world, churches have always been an integral part of the life of poorer communities, serving a role that goes well beyond the purely spiritual. In the local townships, this truth has played out in a unique and profoundly South African way. After 1960, when the Apartheid regime banned political gatherings, it was from the pulpits that the oppressed voiced their rage, and it fell to the church leaders to rally the community under the banner of the one institution that the ruling party could not conceivably ban.

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Today, the churches continue to play an indispensable and variegated role in the cultural and social life of township communities. As a result of the broad range of needs to which they answer, services are somewhat different from those you might be used to. Casual, charismatic, and peppered with jubilant interjections from the congregation, they are as much a platform for community debate and discussion as they are occasions of worship. The welcoming attitude of the churchgoers and the rousing gospel music of the choirs are sure to lift the doourest of spirits, and will leave you with a whole new understanding of what it means to rejoice!

Under no circumstances should you assume that this tour is just for Christians. It's for anyone who has a desire to understand the African community at its most fundamental level and experience firsthand the warmth of its people. Of course, it's also for any fan of Gospel – whether you prefer the music or the teachings of the Good Book.

Before the service, a guided township walk allows us to further explore the vibrant life of the township. We will visit various places of interest such as local shops, a community centre, and private homes To round off our visit, Mama Shumi (on the Kayamandi Gospel tour only), the mother of a local priest, welcomes us into her home for a cup of tea or a glass of homemade ginger beer, and tells us stories about the spiritual life of the township, now and in the difficult years gone by.

This tour brings you right to the heart and soul of South Africa, and into the lives of the ordinary people that earn Cape Town the moniker 'The Friendly City.'
